Introducing Minister Wellness Cohorts!

The goal of the TBMB Minister Wellness Initiative is that no minister would feel alone in ministry. When TBC Ministers were surveyed in February 2025, over 70 percent reported feeling isolated or alone at times in ministry. Almost one third said they feel alone on most days. Ministry done best is not done alone. Jesus paired his disciples in two's as he sent them out. We need others in our lives. Minister Wellness Cohorts provide an opportunity to share ministry with others. As we introduce Minister Wellness Cohorts, we feel it is important to make some clarifications and distinctions:

We want to learn from what we read and provide specific applications that assist in ministry.

☐ A Minister Wellness Cohort is not another accountability group. We will encourage each other and at times hold each other accountable. However, true accountability comes when we learn to trust one another. This trust often develops as we learn from each other on the journey.

☐ A Minister Wellness Cohort is not another seminary course. No one receives a grade – but we do realize that the level of "return" is related to the level of "investment".

☐ A Minister Wellness Cohort is not a "panel of experts". We seek to create an environment where "no one has everything to offer; and no one has nothing to offer". We learn from each other! Our goal is to facilitate an environment where true friendships can be developed.

We are extremely blessed to have been able to share the word of God with 360 souls for the months of Aug. & Sept. Our spotlight evangelical encounter was with a client who came in right before closing which gave me the opportunity to have more of a conversation rather than a one way message. As I spoke with her about how she was spiritually and inquired about her family she became emotional. She told me about a road trip she took with her family and was almost in an accident. She said she began to thank God because they avoided an accident. Her son who is 11yr old said he did not believe in God. I seized the opportunity to ask her to bring him and her 14yr old daughter Saturday so I could share with them. The daughter is a believer and her son stated he did believe in God after our first session. This past weekend he confessed he believes Jesus is the son of God/Lord. Please keep him in prayer as we show him how to be a follower of Jesus Christ our Lord.

We are currently collecting new blankets to be given out to our clients during the winter months and preparing for our Annual Christmas Celebration which will be on December 13th. Last year with your help we gave over 180 Christmas meals, 172 kids snack bags, 30 baby gift bags and 292 new blankets. You continually bless us with the supplies needed so we can help those in our community, and we greatly appreciate all your support. Help Sponsor The New Work at Buen Pastor Avila!



A \$300 scholarship is available to students who will complete a media post about the Mission trip.


